Alexander Bukh (Tsukuba, 2008-2012)

Alexander Bukh is an Associate Professor in International Relations at Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand.

He holds a PhD in International Relations from the London School of Economics and a LLM in International Law from Tokyo University.

Alexander has published extensively on international relations in Northeast Asia. His publications have appeared in academic journals such as Third World Quarterly, The European Journal of International Relations, Asian Survey, International Relations of the Asia Pacific and The Pacific Review.

He is the author of Japan's National Identity and Foreign Policy: Russia as Japan's 'Other' (Routledge, 2008) and These Islands Are Ours: The Social Construction of Territorial Disputes in Northeast Asia (Stanford University Press, 2020), a recipient of the 2020 Choice Award for Outstanding Academic Title, sponsored by the American Library Association and a co-winner of the 2021–2022 ISA Asia-Pacific Distinguished Book Award.

Alexander is also a producer and a co-director of a documentary on territorial disputes-related activism in Japan and Korea titled This Island in Ours (Contented Production, 2016).

Carole Faucher

Carole Faucher is a Canadian socio-anthropologist based in Tangier, Morocco.

She holds an MSc. In Anthropology from the Universite de Montreal and a PhD in Sociology and Anthropology from the National University of Singapore.

She is an Affiliate Professor and course leader with the UNESCO Chair Global Health and Education and Senior Researcher at the Faculty of Medicine and Pharmacy of Tangier, University Abdelmalek Essadi, where she also leads a new diploma course in Higher Education in Prevention, Health Promotion and Health Education for health professionals.

Her current research interests include identity processes, transcultural mediation, health education and health promotion, the co-production of knowledge in global health promotion, and the impact of climate change disasters on schooling in vulnerable communities.

Her latest publications include McLellan, R., Faucher, C., Simovska, V. (eds) (2022) Wellbeing and Schooling: Cross-cultural and Cross-disciplinary Perspectives, London: Springer.

Edson Kenji Kondo (Tsukuba 2003-2007)

Edson Kenji Kondo is the Director of the School of Public Policy and Government at FGV EPPG and the President of the National Association of Graduate Courses in Administration.

He also serves as a Member of the Board of Directors of the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University and visiting professor at the Institute of Strategic Leadership in Japan and Shizenkan University.

Professor Kondo graduated in Production Engineering from the University of São Paulo (1980), obtained an Extension in Economics from the University of Colorado, in Boulder, and did his master's and doctorate in Public Policy from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at from Harvard University between 1990 and 1994.

Professor Kondo was a Professor of Public Policy at the University of Tsukuba from 2003 to 2007.

Makara Phann is currently the Minister Counsellor of the Permanent Mission of Cambodia to the United Nations (since August 2021).

He is the former Director of the International Cooperation Department within the General Department of International Cooperation, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation (MFA-IC) (2019-2021)

Makara Phann was also the Deputy Director of the ASEAN Political-Security Cooperation Department, General Department of ASEAN, MFA-IC (2017-18).

His undergraduate degree is in Archaeology from the Royal University of Fine Arts, Phnom Penh, Cambodia, and his M.A. in International Relations is from the University of Tsukuba.

Makara Phann received the award of "Officer" in the Royal Order of Monisaraphon in 2013.

Nathan Quimpo (2006-2018 & current)

Nathan Gilbert Quimpo is a semi-retired adjunct lecturer of political science and international relations at the University of Tsukuba. He has also taught at the University of the Philippines, University of Amsterdam, Sophia University, Hosei University and Toyo University.

A long-time political activist in the Philippines before turning to academia, Nathan did his Ph.D. in Political Science and International Relations at the Australian National University.

Nathan has authored *Contested Democracy and the Left in the Philippines after Marcos* (Yale University Southeast Asia Studies, 2008) and coauthored *Subversive Lives: A Family Memoir of the Marcos Years* (Ohio University Press, 2016).

He has published articles in various journals, including *Comparative Politics, Pacific Review, Asian Survey, Southeast Asian Affairs, Critical Asian Studies* and *Journal of Asian Security and International Affairs*.

Mari Minowa

Specially Appointed Professor in charge of academic exchange with Latin American universities from April this year. Until her retirement in March this year, she was a full-time professor of the University of Tsukuba from 2002 to 2023. Prior to that, she worked in the field of international development, as economist in the World Bank from 1993 to 2000, and as JICA expert in the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP) from 2000 to 2002.

Prof. Minowa has a Ph.D. in economics from Cornell University in the US, MA in International Studies from the University of Tsukuba, and BS degree in geography from the University of Tokyo. Her field of research is economic and social development in Latin American countries.




